

DIGITAL HEALTHCARE HACKATHON 2017 REGULATIONS

1. Organizer and partner

The Organizers of Digital Healthcare Hackathon are:

INTERIZON Foundation [Organizer] established in UL. 2. Digital Healthcare Hackathon

- 2.1. Digital Healthcare Hackathon is held as a part of the INNOLABS project: "INNOvative LABS for leveraging cross capacity building between ICT, Health, BIO and Medicine sectors for new emerging industries in personalized health". This project has received funding from the European Union's Horizon 2020 research and innovation programme under grant agreement No. 691556.
- 2.2. The Digital Healthcare Hackathon will serve to publicly demonstrate new technologies, to facilitate cooperation between SMEs and stakeholders in the ICT, Bio, Health and Medicine industries and, to provide the opportunity for SMEs to improve their products, services, or business models.
- 2.3. SMEs which want take part in Digital Healthcare Hackathon should present their proprietary technologies dedicated for digital healthcare industry and addressing Digital Healthcare Hackathon challenges presented at <http://infoshare.pl/>
- 2.4. Innovation plans related to the products, services, or solutions owned by participating SMEs will be further improved or adjusted – during hackathon and mentoring session – with regard to market, business, functional, or technical challenges set out for Digital Healthcare Hackathon.
- 2.5. Technologies (products, services, solutions) at issue should have reached appropriate technology readiness level going beyond proof of concept and lab validation phase, i.e. should be qualified as TRL 5 or 6 in terms of TRL definition assumed by European Commission in H2020 Work Programme 2014-2015: https://ec.europa.eu/research/participants/data/ref/h2020/wp/2014_2015/annexes/h2020-wp1415-annex-g-trl_en.pdf
- 2.6. Digital Healthcare Hackathon will be held from 1 March 2017 (start of the qualifications) to 17 May 2017 (demo-day during InfoShare conference).
- 2.7. The Digital Healthcare Hackathon is open to micro, small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs).
- 2.8. Based on the evaluation by the Jury, SMEs participating in the Digital Healthcare Hackathon will be awarded with several prizes. Awarded projects will be also promoted through INNOLABS consortium dissemination channels.
- 2.9. Entry into Digital Healthcare Hackathon means the Digital Healthcare Hackathon acceptance of the Digital Healthcare Hackathon Regulations in whole. The Digital Healthcare Hackathon undertakes to comply with the rules set out in them and confirms that it has met all the conditions for entry into Digital Healthcare Hackathon.

- 2.10. The Digital Healthcare Hackathon schedule is available at <http://infoshare.pl/>. Organizer and Partner reserve the right to modify the Digital Healthcare Hackathon schedule.

3. Participation in the Digital Healthcare Hackathon

- 3.1. The Digital Healthcare Hackathon will be held in three stages.
- 3.2. Every project will be evaluated at each stage based on 4 criteria rated 0-5 points each: Business Model, Business Potential, Team, Innovation. Additionally each project to meet formal requirements has to be a solution for one of the challenges listed on www.infoshare.pl in section dedicated to Digital Healthcare Hackathon.
- 3.3. Stage 1 – Qualifications.
- 3.3.1. To apply for entry in the Digital Healthcare Hackathon, a participant has to register as a startup at infoShare.pl, fill in the entry form available at <http://infoshare.pl/> no later than by 13 April 2017. Pitch-deck template is available on infoShare.pl webpage in section dedicated to Digital Healthcare Hackathon.
- 3.3.2. At this stage, Organizers and Partner will select a maximum of 20 SMEs who will enter the second stage (semi-finals).
- 3.3.3. Organizers and Partner will publish a list of SMEs who have qualified to the second stage of the Digital Healthcare Hackathon, no later than by 28 April 2017 at <http://infoshare.pl/>
- 3.4. Stage 2 – Semi-Finals.
- 3.4.1. At this stage, a maximum of 20 SMEs will take part in workshop session. During this session SMEs will work directly with digital healthcare stakeholders, investors and mentors to improve their innovation projects and address challenges set out for the Digital Healthcare Hackathon.
- 3.4.2. The semi-finals will be held on 16 May 2017.
- 3.4.3. Up to 10 of the SMEs will qualify for the finals. These 10 SMEs will be selected by Jury composed of digital healthcare experts approved by INNOLABS Project Management Committee.
- 3.5. Stage 3 – Finals
- 3.5.1. Each SME who qualifies to the 3rd Stage is obliged to prepare a pitch which will be presented before the Jury to explain what product/solution SME has had before entering Digital Healthcare Hackathon and how this innovation project has been adjusted or improved in the course of Digital Healthcare Hackathon to address the challenges set out by stakeholders. These presentations will take place at the InfoShare conference on 17 May 2017.
- 3.5.2. The members of the Jury will be made known at <http://infoshare.pl/> by 30 April 2017.
- 3.5.3. The Digital Health Hackathon will conclude in a Jury session to select the Digital Healthcare Hackathon winners. The winners will be announced on 17 May 2017 at the infoShare conference.

4. Awards

- 4.1. Appointed Jury will select the winners and award the titles in a public ceremony.
- 4.2. The pay-out will be provided by the Oslo MedTech as a Leader of INNOLABS Project.
- 4.3. The settlement of payment awards will and between Oslo MedTech and SMEs based on signed agreement.
- 4.4. The Digital Healthcare Hackathon winners will receive rewards in order:
- 1st place: 17 500,00 EUR (in words: seventeen thousand five hundred euro)
 - 2nd place: 12 500,00 EUR (in words: twelve thousand five hundred euro)
 - 3rd place: 6000,00 EUR (in words: six thousand euro)
- 4.5. SMEs will have to provide the Social Security and Tax debt clearance, like in any other national grant/public prize that a SME receives
- 4.6. After that INNOLABS consortium will verify (in 15 days the SMEs must provide documentation in this limit):

- existence and public documents of the company in English,
 - no debts with tax office/social security,
 - declaration that the product is their property and have the rights (ownership of the idea/product) and that all eligibility requirements are met.
 - a formal document will be elaborated for this and the Jury decision attached jointly with signature of the coordinator and the SME's.
- 4.7. Payment will be made in another max 15 days.
- 4.8. The winner is obliged to fill in and deliver a signed declaration which forms Appendix to these Regulations.
- 4.9. The award will be transferred to a bank account given in the declaration which forms Appendix 1 to these Regulations.
- 4.10. The winner, who took part in Digital Healthcare Hackathon as part of his business activity, is obliged to account for the pay-out as business income, pursuant to Article 12 of the Income Tax for Legal Persons Act [Journal of Laws, 2016, item 1888 as amended] for Polish Startups, or as appropriate for the winner's country of origin.

5. Other provisions

- 5.1. Digital HealthCare Hackathon will be held in English.
- 5.2. Each SME is obliged to register at www.infoshare.pl.
- 5.3. Any matters not covered by the Digital Healthcare Hackathon Regulations will be governed by the provisions of the Polish Civil Code and the law of the European Union.
- 5.4. The Organizer and Partner reserve the right to modify the Regulations.
